All Animals must be in place by 10 A.M. August 17, 2022

Animals may be brought onto the grounds August 16, 2022 9 A.M.-12 P.M. and 3 P.M.-6 P.M. August 17, 2022 8 A.M -10 A.M.

Animals will be released 6 P.M Sunday August 21, 2022

- **ALL LIVESTOCK ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-ENTERED BY AUGUST 3, 2022. EXCEPT FOR THOSE ENTERING HORSE, OPEN BEEF, SANCTIONED RABBIT, CAVY, AND GOAT SHOW.**
- Health Requirements: See State Health Requirements in General Rule Book
- Exhibitors must furnish hay and bedding for stock
- Competition in this department is open to all counties in New York State
- The Judges decision is final
- Animals shown in groups must be shown in respective individual classes
- Judges may disqualify an animal if unfitted for show such as condition, etc.
- Cows are shown in either dry or milking class, not both
- No bulls allowed in Youth or Open Dairy Shows
- All Exhibitors of registered animals must furnish the Animal Superintendent with the proper Certificate of Registry and Health Records. It shall be the duty of the superintendent to check the identify and ownership of each entry
- No premiums will be paid if the barn space is not cleaned out before exhibitors leave
- All animals shown in a breed class at the Oswego County Fair must be registered with the breed organization of that animal
- All animals except Horses, Dairy Goats and Rabbits, Cavies entering the Sanctioned Shows must stay for the duration of the fair, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- All Oswego County Youth animals must stay duration of fair
- **ALL EXHIBITORS MUST CONFIRM ENTRIES WITH THE ENTRY CLERK PRIOR TO DAY OF SHOW** ☐ Beef exhibitors will not be permitted to wear farm or family names in show ring.

Barn Rules

- No cooking in the barn
- No cots or bedding allowed in barn
- Stalls will be assigned the weekend prior to the fair
- There is a limit of one round bale allowed in barn
- All exhibitors must abide by the code of conduct
